

Bulletin: Crane Operation

For all building sites operating a crane

This bulletin is for informational purposes only. Please be sure to consult the relevant Village of Pemberton bylaws.

Purpose:

This bulletin outlines what is required for safe crane operation within the Village of Pemberton boundaries. As Pemberton continues to grow, the Village must ensure worksite crane operations are executed in a safe and compliant manner to protect residents and site workers from harm.

Do I need a Permit?

A permit is not required from the Village of Pemberton to operate a crane on a worksite within the Village. However, operators must hold a valid operator's certificate issued by the applicable regulatory body acceptable to WorkSafeBC, and follow all WorkSafeBC requirements and guidelines.

What is required from the Village?

The Village requires that developers or builders who use a crane to provide the following documentation upon submission of a building permit:

- Proof of a valid operator's certificate
- Proof of Liability Insurance, not less than \$5,000,000 per occurrence
- Traffic Management Plan if traffic flow will be interrupted

In the event the crane must be placed on Village right of way or property (ie: roads, boulevards, sidewalks etc.) for any period of time, the Village will require the developer or builder to enter into an encroachment agreement. For information on this process please contact nsegovia@pemberton.ca
